Hispanic Program--Progreso Community Center:

Founded first Hispanic community center in Nashville (January 2007). Organized 7 women workers in successful case against a multi-billion dollar corporation for sexual harassment and discrimination. Implemented program English classes (64 students-around 150 hours of classes). Trained 15 Hispanic community members to be community interviewers for Hispanic Health in Nashville Survey (interviewed 505 persons). Trained 6 Hispanic community members for Community Readiness Assessment for Change Survey (interviewed 50 persons). Coordinated the Nashville Latino Health Coalition (Hispanic community members and 15 public health, health care, nonprofit, and academic organizations). Collaborate with Nashville Metropolitan Health Department Latino Birthing Project. Organized 2 culture and talent nights (over 150 people in attendance). Hosted diabetes and nutrition workshops for Cayce Clinic (over 50 people in attendance). Organized workshop on Sexual Harassment and Discrimination in the workplace (Speaker from Southern Poverty Law Center with over 40 people in attendance). Founded Latin American dance group (adults and children). Hosted the Latin American Villas at annual of Celebration of Cultures event (visited by thousands of people). Hosted Health Fair with Meharry Medical College. Hosted enrollment day for CoverKids with Health Access America. Community meetings for civic engagement about immigration reform debate. Organized Peruvian Folk Art Exhibition (over 120 people in attendance). Established childhood obesity project prevention with Lay Health Advisors (*promotoras de salud*). Hosted discussion circle with Vanderbilt Divinity School class and Hispanic community members. Organized meetings with day laborers at PCC community center. Collaborated and facilitated Hispanic community members interaction with Tennessee State University, Vanderbilt University, Meharry Medical College in health-related issues relevant to the Hispanic community in Nashville. Maintained bilingual website.
